**INFORMATION/EVIDENCE SUMMARY:**

I was employed at Narconon from May 1, 2009 to November 3, 2009. My staff position was Course Room Supervisor, Registrar, Graduate Officer, and I/C in charge of building a new charitable Foundation. As such, I was in a staff position to review particular documents concerning the operations at Narconon and I was intimidated to participate in an online fraudulent scam by promising desperate and vulnerable families that we could cure their addictions with a success rate of 70-76%.

The Narconon entity is under the direct control and administration of ABLE International, Narconon International, and the Church of Scientology in California. The Narconon revenue is forwarded to these entities through several means, which I can provide documents upon request.

The allegations of online fraud and conspiracy to commit fraud stem from a complex and very organized system orchestrated by the Church of Scientology and related, named entities aforementioned.

When patients complete the scientology Rehab program at Narconon, the graduates are encouraged to complete a short course called "Field Staff Member" (FSM). Narconon helps the new FSM to build and operate a generic addiction referral website. When a desperate family member does a "drug rehab" Google search, countless websites are returned - - most of these being for Narconon referrals. There is no mention of Narconon or Scientology on these websites.

The victim who call these sites or fill in the "Help Reply Box", are referred to the Registrar at Narconon. I was employed as one of these Registrars. And here is where and when the scam begins.

Registrars are instructed to emphasize a minimum of 70% success rate to the parents who call. Some Narconons in the USA promise a 90% success rate!

The FSM and Registrar split a 10% commission on a treatment fee of \$30,000. If the victim calls directly to the Registrar without an FSM middleman, they pocket the entire 10% or \$3,000 commission for each new patient intake. Some Registrars close 2-5 intakes each week.

When I was the Graduate Officer at Narconon, I had access to 720 patient files and it was my duty to contact and investigate whether the patient had relapsed or was doing well? These inquiries establish that the Narconon promoted, advertised success rate that the FSM and Registrar used as the prominent patient lure.

Within a short time, I established that the true success rate was approximately 20%, not the inflated rate being used. When I informed Narconon and ABLE executives, I was told to calculate the success rate using false data. The patients I could not contact, I was instructed to place in the "doing well" column.

When I refused to participate in their conspiracy to defraud the public, I was scorned and harassed daily.

I left about three weeks later and took the evidence of fraud documents with me.

The Narconon staff, who are also Scientologists, are well aware that the only way for a Narconon patient to remain clean and sober, according to L. Ron Hubbard, is to enroll in the “NED Drug Rundown” offered at the Church of Scientology.

Scientology’s own words about the “NED Drug Rundown” say: “On this rundown, the harmful effects of drugs are erased and a person is freed from the compulsion or need to take drugs. This service handles drugs and the real reason a person started taking them in the first place.”

“Addressing drugs with NED technology removes the barriers that prevent progress up THE BRIDGE levels. It is a vital step on your NED program.”

What these quotations imply is that the Narconon program does NOT erase the harmful effects of drugs, nor does it free a patient from the compulsion or need to take drugs!

As evidence documents prove, Narconon is nothing more than a recruitment center for the Church of Scientology, to expand its cult practices into the secular community using Scientology coercion and exploitation of vulnerable and very ill patients. Aftercare of patients is all but non-existent.

The fact that a patient is likely to relapse soon after completing the Scientology rehab program called Narconon can perhaps best be described as a “predetermined failure”. Contrary to what Narconon claims, Narconon’s actual success rate is not 70%, an imaginary number that is closer to the relapse rate. Narconon executives and other Scientology staff members know well that most patients will relapse, with many returning several times for a so-called repair and forking out thousands of dollars each time.

Narconon websites and brochures profess that Narconon has qualified professional counselors who tend to the individual needs of each patient, when, in fact, many of these Narconon “counselors” have no training whatsoever, except for the Scientology courses taken at each Narconon and a certificate

printed in fancy colors. This alone is what Narconon means by “certified counselor”.

When patients complete the Narconon program, which consists of studying eight Scientology books with Narconon stamped on them and completing the toxic sauna Purification Rundown, many are more confused and unable to cope than when they first arrived. In this vulnerable state, being recruited onto staff by a keen Scientology staff member is no big chore. “Saving lives” is the motto each morning at the military-style roll-call. Playing God in a science-fiction adventure of deception and abuse may be a fitting way to describe the plot of the Narconon story.

Also, these Scientology Rehabs, Narconon, are very dangerous and sometimes deadly. Several recent deaths at Narconon Arrowhead indicate that swift intervention by government and health agencies are forthcoming once investigations are complete.

Senator Tom Ivester is now drafting new legislation to ensure that patients are safe and treated with dignity. The Department of Mental Health in Oklahoma City is also investigating the recent 4 deaths - 3 in the past 9 months. As Senator Ivester stated “where there’s smoke, there’s usually fire.”

The District Attorney’s office is still investigating and criminal charges could be filed?

My understanding, is that the FBI has the jurisdiction to intervene when there is interstate fraud and online scams and I suggest that the subject crimes as described herein, are of grave concern, and should be investigated by your office forthwith to prevent further fraud and death.

I do have several thousand pages of evidence documents and a long list of potential witnesses and will provide upon your request.
